WINTER/SPRING SCHEDULE

FOOTPATH MAINTENANCE TEAM - now "BEVERLEY PATH MINDERS"

The Beverley Ramblers Group covers a large central swathe of East Yorkshire, 34 Parishes in total, from Rudston in the north (due to the share out of Parishes following the collapse of the Ramblers Driffield Group) to Brough/Welton in the south. The remainder are shared between Howden and Goole, Pocklington and Hull / Holderness Ramblers Groups.

In order to assist the E.R.Y.C. Countryside Access Team on small projects at a time of budget cuts, a team of 18 volunteer members have come together as Beverley Path Minders. Funding has been applied for and received from Ramblers Central Office to purchase necessary equipment for digging post holes in order to set way marker and fingerposts. The team have already had a number of mid-week path work gatherings in the Beverley area, when, over a few hours, they have placed new way markers and cleared overgrown vegetation. The inaugural convene was on 28th April and included the Chair, Mr David Court.

EAST YORKSHIRE and DERWENT AREA RAMBLERS web site

We wish to promote this well maintained and very useful web site to all Beverley Group members. Found on the internet at www.eastyorkshireramblers.org.uk this site contains a large collection of material including matters relating to our Beverley Group including information on all start points for scheduled walks within the Area Programme. Please understand there are members who are not too I.T. literate, so here is a step by step account.

Once the internet site home page is opened, under the heading is a brown band. Fourth from the left is 'Groups'. Hover over this word and a drop down box appears with Beverley and click Beverley.

This opens a page relating to our group. It is our intention to use this web area more often to promote articles of interest, news on walks and social events. Please check this area from time to time for updates.

Are you ever unsure about where a walk start point is? Then use this web site to solve your problem. Again, from the home page brown band, select 'Walks' then 'Beverley Walks' to show a list of remaining walk events. Choose your walk selection and click the + sign within the brown circle. This then reveals a drop down box with information relative to the walk including a post code. You can also click on [\[OS Map\]](#) to reveal an arrow pointing on a 1:25,000 map showing the exact start location. Now for the clever bit. Select [\[Google directions\]](#) and a map appears in a separate box showing the start location. In the blue band, type in your location – village or town details then click search (the magnifying glass) and hey presto, a driving route will appear to the walk start location. So no excuses now for not knowing how to navigate to a walk start point.
